

AI has reached the Bar. Train for it properly.

On-site training that closes the gap between what the courts and the regulator now expect, and how members actually work day to day.

The risk is no longer theoretical

In **Ayinde v Haringey [2025] EWHC 1383 (Admin)**, the Divisional Court confronted fabricated authorities in filed documents and made clear that those with leadership responsibilities, including heads of chambers, are expected to take practical and effective measures on the safe use of AI. Weeks later, **MS v SSHD [2025] UKUT 305 (IAC)** reached the Upper Tribunal on AI-fabricated citations. In May 2026 the **BSB's Guidance on the use of AI and Other Technologies** came into force, reading AI directly into the existing Core Duties: competence, confidentiality, honesty and the duty to the court.

For chambers leadership the question is no longer whether members use AI. Most already do. It is whether chambers can show it took practical and effective measures if something goes wrong.

Why online modules don't close the gap

Generic e-learning teaches AI in the abstract. We run the session live, in chambers, working through how AI is and is not being used in your own practice areas, so the guidance translates into behaviour rather than a certificate nobody reads.
